



What about HELL? Does it exist? YES!


Hell is referenced or mentioned over 50 times in scripture.


How does Scripture describe HELL?

Eternal Fire - Matthew 25:41 Lake of Fire – Revelation 20:14-15 Darkness (weeping/nashing of teeth) Matt. 8 **Eternal Punishment – Matthew 13** Separated from God – 2 Thessalonians 1:9 Place of unquenchable fire — Mark 9:43 Second death, eternal destruction - Rev. 21:8 "We have such a short time to prepare for such a long time.

What about Burial or Cremation? 60% are now cremated (doubled in the last 20 years)

Reasons that cremation may be chosen Cost/Expense, Flexibility, Space, Personal Preferences, others... While scripture does not give us a clear answer, we can see what the traditional form of burial was.

Jesus was buried in a tomb – Gospel accounts Many burial sites mentioned in both O.T. and N.T. Joseph was embalmed and laid in casket – Gen. 50 Moses carried Joseph's bones from Egypt – Ex. 13 Stephen, John the Baptist, Lazarus, etc. were buried.

What about the resurrection mentioned in the N.T.?

"The dead in Christ shall rise first" - 1 Thessalonians 4 "For the trumpet will sound, and the dead will be raised imperishable, and we shall be changed. The transformation of the body you have now, into the body you will have, will be instantaneous. All believers will receive this gift at the same time."

1 Corinthians 15:51-52
